- Two Part-time deans: In an effort to reduce chronic absenteeism and the number of students skipping class Hillhouse will hire an additional 2 part-time deans to ensure that students are getting to class and decrease the number of students skipping class. Two Part-time deans will be paid solely through the SIG Grant and has a duration of one school year. The positions are only renewed year to year as needed.
- NewsELA: Online subscription allows for teachers in all subject areas to access leveled texts for students to utilize during instruction allowing to place text at their level in order to access grade level standards.
- LEARN Consultants: Teachers at Hillhouse will be trained on effective instructional and engagement strategies and utilizing block scheduling in order to provide students with rigorous tier 1 and differentiated instruction. According to the School Library Media Research and Research

This training will support our teachers in leveraging the 80-minute instructional block to support content instruction but also provide students with supports within the block to meet their needs. Hillhouse teachers will be trained in planning for Student Engagement Strategies and differentiation according to students' needs. engaged students experience improved academic achievement and satisfaction, are more likely to persist through academic struggles, and earn higher standardized test scores. Engaging students in the learning process increases their attention and focus and moves them to more critical thinking. Instructors who adopt a student-centered approach to instruction increase opportunities for student engagement, which then helps everyone more successfully achieve the course's learning objectives. This training also includes training in Trauma Informed Instruction with elements of Restorative Practices embedded within. Teachers will engage in this work to better understand the students in front of them. Lastly, Leadership training will also be provided to Hillhouse administrators to continue the work after the contract ends and to support teachers as well as provide feedback to teachers regarding instruction. • Hillhouse Pride Initiatives: Hillhouse Pride items will be purchased in order to recognize students who have made improvements in attendance and reducing chronic absenteeism and to continue to create a positive school climate. Recognizing these students and fostering a connection to the school all the while recognizing them for improving attendance will increase a sense of pride and school spirit. As a result, students will attend and perform better academically, be more connected to our school, and civically engaged

School Improvement Grants (SIGs), make competitive subgrants to local educational agencies (LEAs) that demonstrate the greatest need for the funds and the strongest commitment to use the funds to provide adequate resources in order to substantially raise the achievement of students in their lowest-performing schools. Hillhouse will focus on increasing and building capacity of staff to not only instruct in the 80-minute block schedule, but to also develop an instructional framework for the block. The focus will be to use the instructional framework to plan for the students in front of them (differentiation) and utilizing a variety of engagement strategies within their lesson and implementation to increase student engagement.

- Increase Graduation rate from 60.8% (22-23) to 65% (23-24)
- Increase our SPI in Literacy 38.7 (22-23) to 59.2 (23-24)
- Increase our SPI in Math from (22-23) to 57.7 (23-24)

#### 3. How does this grant address School Reform goals?

Since Hillhouse moved to the block schedule last school year, this grant will support the transition and allow for teachers to build their "toolbox" around planning and implementing engaging instruction. Planning and Engagement Strategies will help teachers maximize and

leverage 80-minute instructional blocks to support a diversity of learning styles. In addition, the grant will allow us to fund professional learning which will include support to the whole staff and department (by content) to focus on the instructional framework and expectations for planning and engagement. This will be ongoing throughout the year. Bi-weekly Leadership and Evaluation Coaching for Administrators to support admins in building instructional knowledge and holding staff to high levels of accountability using the evaluations process all the while coaching and supporting teachers in rigorous instruction This will ensure that the work continues throughout and beyond this school year. Lastly, there will be embedded work on Trauma Informed Instruction and Restorative Practices. The grant addresses School Reform Goals by allowing teachers to plan for and engage students, create experiences for improved academic achievement and satisfaction, support students to persist through academic struggles, and earn higher standardized test scores. Engaging students in the learning process increases their attention and focus and moves them to more critical thinking. Instructors who adopt a student-centered approach to instruction increase opportunities for student engagement, which then helps everyone more successfully achieve the course's learning objectives. In addition, students who feel more engaged in class and acknowledge that their needs are being met, are more likely to attend school.
